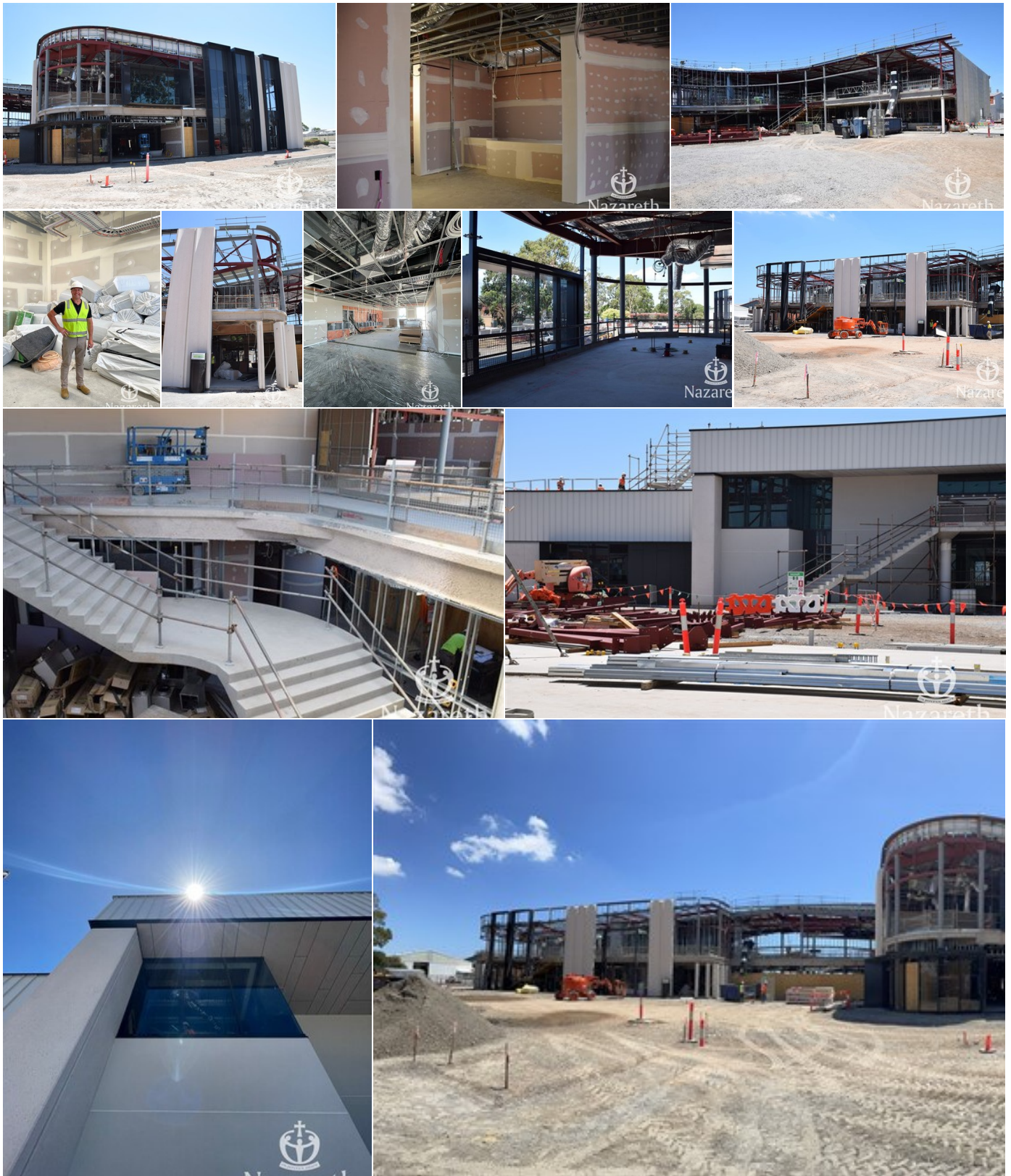




Kidman Park Campus Update
