## NAZARETH TRT DRESS CODE

## Rationale

The TRT Dress Code aims to demonstrate to students, parents and the community, our professionalism and sense of unity and pride in being a member of the Nazareth community.

All Temporary Relief Teachers are expected to support the high standards of the Dress Code, based on the following principles:

- Professionalism
- Modesty
- Neatness
- Work Health Safety requirements.


## Expectations

All TRTs are asked to present in a professional manner within the following guidelines:

- Relief Teacher name badges are to be worn at all times.
- Attire is to be modest and professional, reflecting that of the students.
- Attire is to be of non-denim material and non-leisure style. This includes, but is not limited to, jeans, track pants, tights, t -shirts or activewear (except for Physical/Outdoor Education and Performing Arts).
- Physical/Outdoor Education TRTs are to ensure sports shorts are an appropriate length and that activewear leggings include appropriate cover.
- If you are required to attend College assemblies, Liturgies and Masses, formal functions or parent-related events, TRTs are expected to wear more formal attire.
- If TRTs are required to attend retreats, camps and similar activities, they are encouraged to dress in modest, neat, casual attire that is appropriate to those activities.
- Hair should be neat and tidy and facial hair should be neatly trimmed.
- Body art should be covered and not visible.
- Facial piercings (both studs and rings), earring spacers and undergarments should not be visible.
- All TRTs are expected to dress in a sun-safe manner, including wearing a hat, during yard duties and outdoor occasions and activities.
- WHS should be considered when selecting shoes, particularly if working in practical areas.
