



### R-12 | 2023 Tuition Fees

The annual tuition fee has been billed to your account and statements (along with the College Financial Information for Families for 2023 booklet) were posted this week.

#### 2023 Other Student Charges

Other student charges such as music instrument hire, academy fees, co-curricular sport etc will be billed after April 2023 and may continue to be added to your account throughout the year.

#### When are fees due to be paid?

All fees are required to be paid on a regular basis (weekly or fortnightly) and must be paid in full by 10 November 2023. Direct debit by BPAY is the College's preferred payment method.

Families seeking to make payments outside our required payment cycle must contact the Finance Office to discuss their proposed plan.

#### **Early Payment Discount**

An early payment discount of 5% is applicable to the net tuition fee (gross fee less all applicable discounts) if paid in full by 31 March 2023.

### **External Sibling Discount**

External Sibling Discounts are available for children attending another Catholic Parish Primary School and the form (available from our website) must be returned to the Finance Office by 31 March 2023.

#### **School Card Discount or Fee Remissions**

A School Card discount of 50% on the net tuition fees is available for approved families. Please refer to our website www.nazareth.org.au/college/finance for further information. Families who receive the school card discount are also eligible to apply for a partial fee remission (based on their financial circumstances.)

Families who do not qualify for School Card but who may have difficulty in meeting the tuition fee payment requirements may apply for a partial fee remission.

The Fee Remission / Fee Reduction Application form is available from the Finance Office or Flinders Park Reception.

#### Who do I contact?

Our Finance staff are located at the Findon Campus (176 Crittenden Road, Findon).

Families may still choose to collect or submit forms and pay their school fees by credit card or EFTPOS at the Flinders Park Campus Reception.

# R-12 | Premier's Reading Challenge

Each year, Nazareth students participate in the Premier's Reading Challenge (PRC). The challenge is to read 12 books.

8 books from the PRC list (books in the Library have coloured stickers on the spines). 4 books of your own choosing (which may or may not be on the PRC booklist)

• Red Stickers: Reception to Year 2

• Green Stickers: Years 3 to 5

• Yellow Stickers: Years 6 to 9

 Years 10-12 students may read 12 books of their own choice at an appropriate literacy level for each student and may include prescribed texts.

The class teachers from Reception to Year 2 complete the challenge with their students.

Year 3 and 4 classes complete their reading record sheet in hard copy.

Year 5 and 6 classes complete their reading record on the desktop of their school laptop and then print into hard copy.

All completed reading records will need to be returned to the class teacher (R-6) or Library Staff (7-12) by Friday 25 August.

- a balance between beginning, middle and end
- appealing design, layout and format; illustrations that complement the text (if applicable)
- · presentation and neatness

# Year 4 | CyberSafe Families Information Night

This is a reminder about the Year 4 CyberSafe Families Parent/Caregiver Information Night Monday 20 February (Week 4) in the MacKillop Hall from 6:30-8:00 pm. A number of Year 4 families have not yet registered to attend this session.

Children in Year 4 will be receiving a laptop as a tool for their learning. An integral part of Nazareth's Laptop Agreement requires both students and parent/caregivers to attend a Cyber Safety information session presented by Cybersafe Families.

The Parent/Caregivers session on Monday 20 February, is a compulsory information session that at least one adult member of the family must attend, so that your child can begin taking home their laptop. If you are not able to attend this session, it will be necessary to attend a make-up session.

This session will provide strategies to make the home environment cyber safe. It is important to fully understand both the opportunities and the threats that the online world present, and to be equipped with the knowledge about the best practices available to protect your family. This is a fantastic opportunity for you to learn more about young people and the online environment, and how you can help your child to be a safe and responsible user of technology.

The student session will occur during school hours and will cover:

- · Skills that encourage young people to be good digital citizens
- · Ways for students to conduct themselves online safely and respectfully
- · Guidance on how to have positive online experiences
