#### R-12 | Safety Reminder

Students and families are reminded to be wary of approaches from strangers, especially when they are unaccompanied or travelling to and from school. If they are approached, students should not respond and should not accept offers of rides or gifts.

Students should seek the assistance of other nearby adults if they feel unsafe and should report the event to a trusted adult (parent / caregiver or school staff member) as soon as possible.

SAPOL advises that taking out a mobile phone and calling police can deter the offender and they recommend the student making a formal report to their closest police station.

#### R-12 | Child Safeguarding

As we move towards the end of Term 1, we take this opportunity to remind you of our commitment to safeguarding all of the children in our care. At Nazareth, the safety and protection of students is of the utmost importance and as parents, you too have a crucial role in ensuring that your children are safe and protected, both at home and at school. We encourage you to take the time to review our Child Safeguarding policies and procedures, available on our website.

#### R-12 | Play Your Part In Positive Driver Behaviour

Does your driver behaviour in and around our campuses support the safety of students, families and the wider community?

As a community a far greater commitment and shared responsibility needs to be reflected in driver behaviour in our neighbouring streets and onsite kiss and drop zones.

Despite misconceptions, Nazareth do not have any jurisdiction over the surrounding streets. We do however, continually work with the local Council and the Department of Transport regarding traffic concerns and challenges.

What is the best thing you can do?

Take 5 minutes to re-familiarise yourself, and your child with the expectations around your campus.

#### R-12 | 2023 Tuition Fees – Early Payment Discount

An early payment discount of 5% is applicable to the net tuition fee (gross fee less all applicable discounts) if paid in full by Friday, 31 March 2023.

If no payment is received by 31 March 2023, the Finance Office will make contact with you unless a continuous direct debit (weekly or fortnightly) commences immediately. Accounts are to be paid in full by 10 November 2023.

#### **External Sibling Discount**

External Sibling discounts are available for children attending another Catholic Parish Primary School. The form is available from our website here. It must be returned to the Finance Office by Friday, 31 March 2023.

#### School Card Discount or Fee Remissions

A School Card discount of 50% on the net tuition fees is available for approved families. Please refer to our website for further information. Families who receive the school card discount are also eligible to apply for a partial fee remission (based on their financial circumstances).

Families who do not qualify for School Card but who may have difficulty in meeting the tuition fee payment requirements may apply for a partial fee remission.

The Fee Remission / Fee Reduction Application form is available from the Finance Office or Flinders Park Reception.

Our Finance staff are located at the Findon Campus at 176 Crittenden Road, Findon.

Families may still choose to collect or submit forms and pay their school fees by credit card or EFTPOS at the Flinders Park Campus Reception.

#### 7-12 | Learning Conversations & Early Dismissal Reminder

- Next Tuesday 4 April (Week 10) is 7-12 Learning Conversations for the year.
- Next Tuesday 4 April (Week 10) is Early Dismissal (1;30pm) for students.

Learning Conversations is an important opportunity for students, parents and staff to share and discuss the learning that has occurred so far.

Previously learning conversations were held in Term 2, however we have moved them forward as an earlier touch point with teachers before the end of the first term. We have chosen to continue to follow the format of phone conversations undertaken in recent years. This was based on an informal review of data over previous learning conversations which indicated a larger and more positive uptake of conversations occurring over the phone. Anecdotally, feedback from parents/ caregivers was that they appreciated having increased flexibility to be involved in learning conversations via phone during convenient times for them throughout the night, rather than having to be at a specific location.

We wish to remind our families that they do not need to wait for learning conversations in order to make contact with teachers about progress. We continue to encourage our families to engage with SEQTA to see ongoing progress with students achievements and when required make contact with teachers to discuss student progress.

As we move toward our Middle and Senior Campus structures in 2024, we will be seeking feedback from our community about the format of learning conversations and would appreciate when this comes out, for families to take the time to complete a short survey indicating their preference. This could include Face to Face, Phone or a combination of both.

Please note, the Veritas Centre will not be open for Academic Support after early dismissal on Tuesday.

We encourage, where possible that your child joins in these conversations as a contributor to their learning. For parents / caregivers who were unable to make a time with a teacher, please email them directly to arrange for a suitable alternative time.

#### 7-12 | Process for Collecting Your Child In School Time

We understand that at times students need to be picked up early from Nazareth for various reasons. If this is the case can we please ask you to follow some guidelines to assist us with ensuring this occurs smoothly.

- Ensure your child is fully aware what time they need to sign out.
- Please inform student services (student.services\_S@nazareth.catholic.edu.au) and your child's teacher prior to the day, this can be done via email or via a hand written note signed by you as a parent/caregiver.
- Students are asked to inform their teacher at the start of the lesson if they have an early departure.
- Please have a conversation with your child to see what lesson they will be missing by departing early, for example leaving in the middle of a practical lesson or test would be disruptive to the students learning, however staff knowing this in advance may allow for alternatives.
- If a child does not have an email or note confirming an early departure then student services will ring a parent / caregiver to confirm.
- All students must sign out via student services.
- We understand that at times sufficient forewarning is not always possible. If a parent / caregiver calls the College just prior to a pick up time, with little forewarning, please understand that it can take time for this action to occur and is dependent on what other students needs may be being met at that time. We appreciate your patience if you do need to wait.
- We remind all students who arrive late to sign in at Student Services and if possible provide a note / email with the reason, if you have not contacted the absentee line.
