## **R-6 | Application Awards**

There will be a slight change to the Application Awards from this Semester Report onwards.

Application Awards will now be presented to a maximum of five students per class, irrespective of the total number of Outstanding Applications received in a student's semester report. Class teachers will choose the students to be recognised for their outstanding application to all aspects of their learning in the classroom and beyond.

The Academic Awards will continue to be presented to students who meet the criteria, as outlined below:

The Academic Excellence Award recognises outstanding academic achievement of students throughout each semester. These are measured by the total number of 'A' Grades achieved and importantly, only two results can be outside of the A grade band, and nothing less than a C grade.

## **R-6 | OSHC and Vacation Fee Payments**

To help protect CCS against fraud and non-compliance, from 1 July 2023 the Australian Government legislation has directed that families using childcare must pay the gap fee using electronic means. This means we will no longer be able to accept cash payments for childcare gap fees (ie the difference between the provider's fee and the Child Care Subsidy (CCS) amount).

If you don't claim CCS and pay full fees, you may continue to pay your full fees in cash only at the Kidman Park Finance Office (Cash is not accepted at the Findon Campus Reception.)

## **Year 4 | Mass & Celebration of Learning**

## Year 10 | MFS Road Awareness Presentation

As many parents would be aware, when time comes for our children to hold a driver's license we are fraught with a mixed bag of emotions - pride, nervousness, and anxiety. We are all conscious that the road is a dangerous place to be – especially for young and inexperienced drivers. Statistics show that vehicle accidents are one of the major causes of death in young people in South Australia every year.

To better equip our youth as they start the journey towards obtaining their licenses, Nazareth will be hosting the Metropolitan Fire Service Road Awareness Program (RAP) for all Year 10 students on Friday 4 August.

This hard-hitting and eye-opening presentation by the MFS provides students with a raw, honest and open insight into the experience of firefighters working in road crash rescue and through conversations with a road crash survivor as well as a family member who has lost a loved one, provides realistic understanding into the trauma that road accidents cause. Through these impact statements and conversations, students are made aware of the power of their choices on the road and the consequences of actions that could have a devastating affect on themselves, their loved ones and others.

The RAP presentation seeks to engage future young drivers through positive peer pressure and with its core message of "You get to choose the risk; but you don't get to choose the consequences" hopes to enable our students to make supported, empowered and considered choices on the road.
