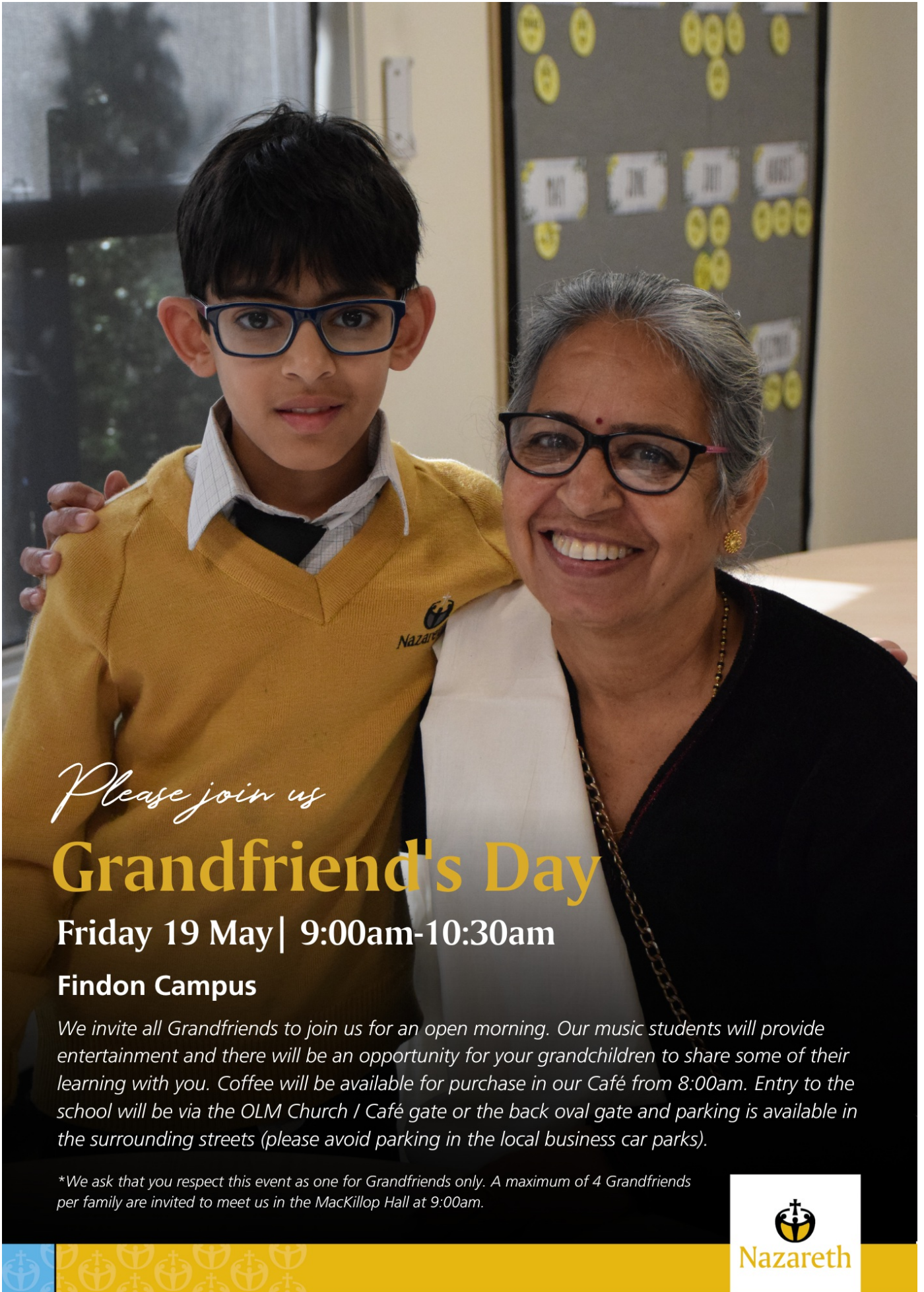

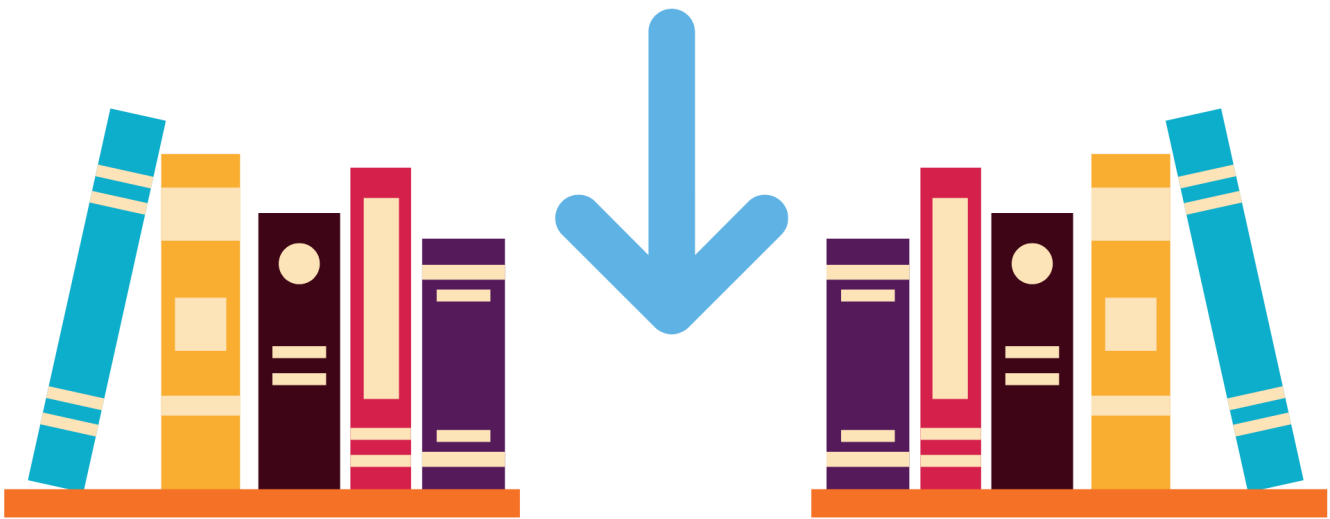

PLEASE RETURN YOUR LIBRARY BOOKS, READERS OR READER PACKS



We ask that all families have a check around home for any readers, reader packs or library books that are yet to be returned to school.

As you can imagine, Nazareth spends a considerable amount of money on PM readers, decodable readers and books for the students to take home, and when they are not returned to school, the variety of books available for the students to access diminishes greatly.

Should you find any books that belong to Nazareth, please return them to your child's class teacher or the Resource Centre (Library) as soon as possible.

We appreciate your support in ensuring all readers and books are returned in a timely manner and in the state in which they were borrowed.

Years 1 & 2 | Materials Required for Projects

Year 1 and 2 students are required to **bring a named shoe box to school by Monday 29 May (Week 5)**, to form the base of a diorama. Any spares are also welcome for other children to use.

Year 1 students will be learning about Living Things in Science this term. As part of their learning, the students will be constructing dioramas of animals and their habitats in our Technologies lesson.

Year 2 students are learning about Aboriginal Culture in Humanities and Social Sciences. As part of their learning, the students will be constructing dioramas of a Dreaming Story in our Technologies lesson.

As these tasks also have a focus on sustainability, we would like to repurpose items where possible. If you could please support your child in collecting other clean recyclable materials, in accordance with their planning that would be greatly appreciated. Recyclable materials may include: cereal / muesli bar boxes, paper towel cardboard rolls (no toilet rolls please), plastic bottles, plastic lids, egg cartons,

corks, catalogues.

We will also have some materials available at school. Thank you for your support.

Years 2-6 | Uniform Requirements for School Sport Training

We acknowledge that it can be problematic for students to have to get changed in and out of their winter uniform at school in order to participate in before and / or after school training sessions. Therefore, in Terms 2 and 3, students who have school sport training before or after school are permitted to wear their sport uniform on the day of their training.

Should your child wish to wear specific football or soccer attire to train in after school, they are required to wear their winter uniform throughout the day and get changed after school.

Students who train during their lunch time are required to wear their winter uniform and put their sneakers on for the duration of the training and then change back into their black leather school shoes for the remainder of the day.

Class teachers will be provided with a training schedule and a list of students involved. Should a student choose to wear their sport uniform on a day that is not their designated sport uniform day for the class or a training day, without a note from a parent / caregiver, they will be issued with a 'Presentation and Uniform' notification. Should a student receive three of these in a term, they will need to attend the Reflection Room for a conversation with a member of the Leadership Team and their future participation in school sport will be discussed.

The staff appreciate your support in helping to ensure that your child/ren wear the correct uniform to school.
