#### Reception | Independence Days Extended

Due to the success of Independence Days across Reception classrooms, as of Week 6 Independence Days will now include Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday mornings.

Reception teachers would like to sincerely congratulate students on the resilience, organisation and readiness for learning they have shown on Independence Days. Families are sincerely thanked for supporting this initiative and for encouraging their children to demonstrate these skills on all days of the school week.

#### Years 2-6 | Uniform Requirements for School Sport Training

We acknowledge that it can be problematic for students to have to get changed in and out of their winter uniform at school in order to participate in before and / or after school training sessions. Therefore, in Terms 2 and 3, students who have school sport training before or after school are permitted to wear their sport uniform on the day of their training.

Should your child wish to wear specific football or soccer attire to train in after school, they are required to wear their winter uniform throughout the day and get changed after school.

Students who train during their lunch time are required to wear their winter uniform and put their sneakers on for the duration of the training and then change back into their black leather school shoes for the remainder of the day.

Class teachers will be provided with a training schedule and a list of students involved. Should a student choose to wear their sport uniform on a day that is not their designated sport uniform day for the class or a training day, without a note from a parent / caregiver, they will be issued with a 'Presentation and Uniform' notification. Should a student receive three of these in a term, they will need to attend the Reflection Room for a conversation with a member of the Leadership Team and their future participation in school sport will be discussed.

The staff appreciate your support in helping to ensure that your child/ren wear the correct uniform to school.




#### 7-12 | Kidman Park Information Evening

#### Year 9 | Rite Journey Mentoring Program

In 2023, students participating in the Rite Journey will learn about the importance of mentoring in young people's lives. The familiar saying 'It takes a village to raise a child' is an indication of the importance for children and adolescents to be surrounded by well-meaning adults; they are best served by a community of guidance.

When one adult relationship in a teenager's life is under stress, it is vital that other adult relationships take the strain, rather than allowing the peer relationships to take on the guiding roles - something young people are not well equipped to do.

There is a healthy body of research which suggests that the more adults that adolescents are connected to in a positive way, the less

risk factors they will expose themselves to, and hence they are safer. With this in mind, we are encouraging all families to select a mentor for their child. This person should be an adult who is willing to be in regular contact with the student and give their time freely.

The role of the mentor is to:

- · Develop a trusting relationship
- · Support parental values
- · Provide help in developing social skills
- Share in celebrating milestones
- · Listen to dreams, ideas and concerns
- Promote the discovery of undeveloped potential.

In selecting a mentor, they should be someone who:

- Already has a positive involvement with the child and/or family
- Is willing to have meaningful conversations with the child
- If interested and able, would be willing to complete a shared Rite Journey Mentor project. This project would be up to the student and mentor to decide and implement together as they see fit.

Your child has been given a letter from their Rite Journey teacher to pass onto their chosen mentor.
