
Year 7 Italian Culture Day - Thursday 29 June and Friday 30 June, 9am - 12noon, Flinders Park Campus

On Saturday 5 August, the Catholic Office for Youth and Young Adults (COYYA) are hosting a local World Youth Day celebration in Adelaide for those aged 18-35. The day will include interactive workshops, a special WYD liturgy and concert at Sacred Heart College, Somerton Park.

The main workshop is delivered by Gianna Lucas – co-founder and CEO of Happow, a gamified eLearning life skills platform to help young people not just survive but thrive! Gianna will help young people identify their gifts and talents and share practical ways of responding to the needs of the world today.

A workshop series will follow the main workshop with a variety of relevant topics available for young people to choose. These sessions will be led by youth leaders from Adelaide who are making a difference in our communities. The sessions are designed to inform, create a space of dialogue and encourage young people to take action.

A special World Youth Day liturgy will take place linking into the theme of WYD. This liturgy will involve interpreting the gospel passage of "Mary arose and went with haste" (Lk 1:39) through contemporary music and dance, an opportunity to reflect on the current world and how we continue to respond to the needs today.

Ending the night with a celebration – the WYD concert features Rock Indie duo, Gus & Iggy from Wollongong and local musicians. Gus & Iggy have performed at events across Australia, including the Australia Catholic Youth Festival. Gus & Iggy will bring the sounds and energy of WYD through music for our young people.



This a reminder for families that **Thursday 6 July and Friday 7 July (Week 10) will be pupil free days** for all 7-12 students due to Staff Formation Day.



Year 9 | Rite Journey Mentoring Program

In 2023, students participating in the Rite Journey will learn about the importance of mentoring in young people's lives. The familiar saying 'It takes a village to raise a child' is an indication of the importance for children and adolescents to be surrounded by well-meaning adults; they are best served by a community of guidance.

When one adult relationship in a teenager's life is under stress, it is vital that other adult relationships take the strain, rather than allowing the peer relationships to take on the guiding roles - something young people are not well equipped to do.

There is a healthy body of research which suggests that the more adults that adolescents are connected to in a positive way, the less risk factors they will expose themselves to, and hence they are safer. With this in mind, we are encouraging all families to select a mentor for their child. This person should be an adult who is willing to be in regular contact with the student and give their time freely.

The role of the mentor is to:

- · Develop a trusting relationship
- · Support parental values
- Provide help in developing social skills
- · Share in celebrating milestones
- · Listen to dreams, ideas and concerns
- Promote the discovery of undeveloped potential.

In selecting a mentor, they should be someone who:

- · Already has a positive involvement with the child and/or family
- · Is willing to have meaningful conversations with the child
- If interested and able, would be willing to complete a shared Rite Journey Mentor project. This project would be up to the student and mentor to decide and implement together as they see fit.

Your child has been given a letter from their Rite Journey teacher to pass onto their chosen mentor.

Careers, Pathways and Partnerships | Year 10 Try-a-Trade

Western Technical College will once again be offering Try-A-Trade courses during Term 3, 2023.

Try-A-Trade is designed for Year 10 students to explore hands-on training in various industry areas, and supports students to explore their future pathways.

Students work with industry professionals and trainers to undertake practical tasks that showcase the reality of work and skills needed in industry. The courses are non-accredited and provide valuable insights and experiences that will be useful when applying for VET courses and Flexible Industry Pathways (FIPs) as part of SACE in years 10, 11 and 12. - Salon and Barbering Try-A-Trade (\$TBC)- 2 days of training, day to be confirmed.

SABIT offer 12-month pre-university programs that are nationally accredited Diploma qualifications in their own right, and may be used to transfer into degree courses, with credit, in areas like Architecture, Business & Commerce, Engineering, IT, Marketing, Health, Nursing, Pharmacy, Psychology, Social Work and many more.

Successful completion of SACE is required before commencing. An ATAR is not necessary. SABIT students attend UniSA campuses, use Uni SA facilities, and are taught by university lecturers.

As well as providing some hands-on skills and understanding about the child care industry and pathways, participation in the day can be used as evidence of your learning for your enrolment in future study.

Please register your interest here so you don't miss out on this great opportunity.

This immersion Day would also be a great introduction if you are interested in undertaking the Cert III in Early Childhood Education and Care in the 2023 mid-year intake. Starting this qualification mid-year is great for any student who will be going into Year 12 in 2024 because it will help with the placement completion of the 160 hours, and will also allow more flexibility with end of SACE resulting in 2024. A Working with Children Check is a prerequisite to participate in the Cert III ECEC. Cert III in ECEC will incur a cost to families (to be subsidised by Nazareth Catholic College). Classes are held every Friday during the term, commencing 21st July 2023. Theory classes resume in mid-January 2024 and will finish mid-year.
