R-6 | Curriculum and Reporting Changes

As you may be aware, the Australian Curriculum recently underwent a review which saw the previous version (v8.4) refined, re-aligned and decluttered in order to identify the essential content that students are required to learn at each year level. This year, Reception to Year 6 teachers have been using the latest version (v9) for planning across all curriculum areas. Version 9 provides better alignment between achievement standards, content descriptions, and improved links between learning areas and the general capabilities and cross-curriculum priorities.

The Mathematics curriculum in particular underwent significant review, and some of the changes are outlined below. There is now:

- a stronger focus on students mastering the essential mathematical facts, skills, concepts and processes, and being introduced to these at the right time.
- a strengthened focus on students developing the mathematical processes of mathematical modelling, computational thinking, statistical investigation, probability experiments and simulations.
- raised standards by introducing content earlier (for example lifting standards in Year 1 in relation to addition and subtraction, with additional content setting expectations about recall and proficiency with multiplication facts, beginning in Year 2) expanding depth and/or breadth of content and including new content.

In response to the changes within the curriculum, we have used this as an opportunity to look at our Semester Reports. You may notice some slight changes to how the following learning areas are reported on, in order to align with how the curriculum is presented.

English and Mathematics will now show an overall grade rather than separate grades for each strand within the respective learning areas.

Health and Physical Education are reported on as one learning area, not separately as they were previously. You will note that the Application Grade is in reference to application in Physical Education, not Health.

The subject areas for Technologies and The Arts are reported on separately. For example, Technologies has the subject areas of Design and Technology and Digital Technologies and The Arts has Visual Art, Music, Dance and Drama.

Given the change to the curriculum, and what is now required to receive an A grade, you may notice that your child receives less As or Bs than in previous years. This will have an effect on the number of students who receive an Academic Award.

As always, the staff appreciate your support and understanding, and the respect that you show towards their professional knowledge and judgement as educators.

Year 10 | MFS Road Awareness Presentation

As many parents would be aware, when time comes for our children to hold a driver's license we are fraught with a mixed bag of emotions - pride, nervousness, and anxiety. We are all conscious that the road is a dangerous place to be – especially for young and inexperienced drivers. Statistics show that vehicle accidents are one of the major causes of death in young people in South Australia every year.

To better equip our youth as they start the journey towards obtaining their licenses, Nazareth will be hosting the Metropolitan Fire Service Road Awareness Program (RAP) for all Year 10 students on Friday 4 August.

This hard-hitting and eye-opening presentation by the MFS provides students with a raw, honest and open insight into the experience of firefighters working in road crash rescue and through conversations with a road crash survivor as well as a family member who has lost a loved one, provides realistic understanding into the trauma that road accidents cause. Through these impact statements and conversations, students are made aware of the power of their choices on the road and the consequences of actions that could have a devastating affect on themselves, their loved ones and others.

The RAP presentation seeks to engage future young drivers through positive peer pressure and with its core message of “You get to choose the risk; but you don't get to choose the consequences” hopes to enable our students to make supported, empowered and considered choices on the road.

Careers, Pathways and Partnerships | Year 10 Try-a-Trade

Western Technical College will once again be offering Try-A-Trade courses during Term 3.

Try-A-Trade is designed for Year 10 students to explore hands-on training in various industry areas, and supports students to explore their future pathways.

Students work with industry professionals and trainers to undertake practical tasks that showcase the reality of work and skills needed in industry. The courses are non-accredited and provide valuable insights and experiences that will be useful when applying for VET courses and Flexible Industry Pathways (FIPs) as part of SACE in Years 10, 11 and 12. See here what our current Try-A-Trade students are up to at Western Technical College.

Important Information:

- Limited places are available.
- Nazareth will contribute 50% of the course cost.
- Students will need to organise their own transport to and from Western Technical College.

Try-a-Trade Offering

- **Automotive Try-A-Trade (\$60)**- 2 days of training, Friday
- **Construction Try-A-Trade (\$144)**- 5 days of training (including accredited White Card), Thursday
- **Engineering Try-A-Trade (\$60)**- 2 days of training, Friday
- **Plumbing Try-A-Trade (\$60)**- 2 days of training, Friday
- **Screen and Media / ICT / CAD Try-A-Trade (\$60)**- 2 days of training, day to be confirmed - possibly Thursday Term 3 - waiting on confirmation from TAFE
- **Salon and Make-Up Try-A-Trade (\$60)**- 2 days of training, day to be confirmed - possibly Wednesday, Thursday, Friday in Term 4 - waiting on confirmation from TAFE
- **Salon and Barbering Try-A-Trade (\$TBC)**- 2 days of training , day to be confirmed.
