To assist students in developing the skills and necessary expertise, examinations are scheduled for many Stage 1 (Year 11) subjects at the end of each semester. Utilising similar procedures to those undertaken for SACE Stage 2 (Year 12) Examinations, the College provides this type of assessment with the purpose of assessing knowledge and understanding of the coursework, strengthening concepts of organisation and revision, and preparing students for Stage 2 SACE Examinations. Examination results will be recorded on SEQTA and the Semester 1 Report. Please see further details and the examination schedule on the following pages.

Week 10 (30th **June – 4**th **July):** students will participate in a range of experiences:

- Monday 30th June: **Subject Selection Information Day** A day dedicated to future pathway planning.

Examination Details

WHERE: Examinations will be held upstairs at our Senior Campus at Kidman Park.

Students are *only to be at school when they have an examination scheduled*. Students with an examination in sessions 1 and 3, with a break in between, must sign in at student services and stay on site. If students are on-site at other times, they must also sign in and work silently in the hub area.

WHEN: The exams will be held over a 4-day period from Tuesday 24th to Friday 27th June. Please see Examination schedule on the next page. All students will have Monday 23 June off to use as a study-from-home day in preparation for their exams.

HOW DO STUDENTS PREPARE: Students should check with their teacher(s) about the subject matter that will be examined and the requirements for each examination ie use of a calculator, note sheets, etc. and allocate time during the weeks preceding the examinations specifically for revision.

WHAT TO BRING TO THE EXAM: Students should bring the appropriate equipment for the subject (at least 2 pens, sharp pencils, ruler, eraser, calculator, etc) in a clear plastic sleeve. Students will not be able to borrow equipment from other students once they have entered the examination room. If required bottled water, glucose lollies and tissues may be brought to the examination.

RULES AND EXPECTATIONS: All students will be in the correct formal uniform for all examinations and are expected to arrive at the examination room 10 minutes before the scheduled start of the exam.

Mobile phones, smartwatches, pencil cases, calculator covers, school bags etc. must not be brought into the examination room.

There will be no student movement during the first and last half an hour of each examination. Students are required to remain in the examination room until the allocated time has lapsed. Students must not disturb others at any time during the examination; silent conditions will be strictly enforced.

Absence from any examination will require communication with the College by **9 am** on the day of the exam. **Unexplained absences** will result in an '**Incomplete**' grade recorded and a **zero** result for this assessment. This may impact both the overall SACE grade received for the subject and subject choices for 2025.

Retreat Day

Nazareth Catholic College promotes a holistic range of experiences to support them in their academic, well-being and spiritual growth. This is a compulsory day for Year 11 students to strengthen relationships with peers and teachers and to nourish their individual spirituality. The day will conclude with dinner, with parents invited to join us from 5:30 pm. We hope all students will embrace the late finish as a valuable time spent with their community.

Made in the Image of God Sexuality and Respectful Relationships Curriculum (MITIOG) – Year 11 Spiritualities, Religion and Meaning

Dear Parents and Caregivers,

The Made in the Image of God Sexuality and Respectful Relationships Curriculum (MITIOG) is the official program for sexuality and respectful relationships education in South Australian Catholic Schools for Years R-12. Each year our students engage with age-appropriate curriculum content regarding sexuality and respectful relationships through MITIOG. This year this curriculum will be taught for Semester 1 Year 11 RE students in Term 2, Week 8.

Catholic understanding is that all humans are made in the image of God and therefore deserving of the utmost dignity and honour, and that our sexuality is a fundamental dimension of the human person. We acknowledge that the beliefs, values and insights of the Christian Tradition and Catholic moral teaching enrich our lives.

The MITIOG curriculum content is captured and delivered across 2-year stages. Attached is a summary of the concepts your child will learn about in MITIOG across their particular 2-year stage. This year, the content to be covered for Year 11 students will be:

- An appreciation of the Christian understanding of the human person in an exploration of the legal and moral responsibilities regarding sexual identity and behaviour.
- An appreciation of the nature of intimacy and commitment in relationships and the role they play in human flourishing.

We acknowledge that families are the first educators of their child's sexuality and that it is the role of the school to support families in this area. We are committed to supporting and enriching these partnerships. Whilst this curriculum is taught in South Australian Catholic schools, should you wish for your child to be excluded from classes and be given other work, please indicate this in writing via email to myself, at rebecca.maio@nazareth.catholic.edu.au, before the 9th of June 2025.

Concept Summary Years 11-12

Thread: Identity

Students develop an understanding of self as a whole person and the influences that shape identity.

• An appreciation of the Christian understanding of the human person in an exploration of the legal and moral responsibilities regarding sexual identity and behaviour.

Thread: Relationships

Students develop an understanding that humans are created for one another, and how loving, respectful and fulfilling relationships lead to positive well-being.

An appreciation of the nature of intimacy and commitment in relationships and the role they
play in human flourishing.

Thread: Human Development

Students develop an understanding of the physical, social, emotional and psychological and spiritual changes that occur at different stages of life.

• no content in Years 11-12

Thread: Reproduction & Reproductive Health

Students in middle primary onwards develop understanding about reproductive development and an awareness of respectful, healthy and responsible behaviours.

 A deeper understanding of how to live with sexual integrity and that sexual behaviours can have physical, psychological, emotional and social implications. (Optional content as this is an extension of Years 9-10)

Teaching Protocols for this Curriculum:

- Families are the first educators of their child's sexuality.
- Prior to the commencement of teaching the MITIOG curriculum, parents/carers must be informed.
- Class relationships are very important. All teachers are required to have taught the students in the class for at least one term before teaching the MITIOG curriculum.
- Introduction to MITIOG Training is mandated for all teachers before teaching this curriculum.
- Teachers are required to be familiar with the Catholic Church Teaching regarding human sexuality and respectful relationships.
- ALL CESA schools have an appointed MITIOG Key Teacher to support families and teachers.
