WHERE: Examinations will be held at our St Gabriel's Centre. Students will be asked to move into the examination room 20 minutes prior to the commencement of the exams.

Students are ***only to be at school when they have an examination scheduled***. Students with an examination in sessions 1 and 3, with a break in between, must sign in at student services and stay on site at the Study Room at Flinders Park Campus. If students are on-site at other times, they must also sign in and work silently in the designated study room.

WHEN: The exams will be held over a 4-day period from Monday 24 – Thursday 27 November. All students will have Friday 21st November off to use as a study-from-home day in preparation for their exams.

HOW DO STUDENTS PREPARE: Students should check with their teacher(s) about the subject matter that will be examined and the requirements for each examination ie use of a calculator, note sheets, etc. and allocate time during the weeks preceding the examinations specifically for revision. Subject teachers will provide opportunities for preparation within normal lesson times.

WHAT TO BRING TO THE EXAM: Students should bring the appropriate equipment for the subject (*at least 2 pens, sharp pencils, ruler, eraser, calculator, etc*) in a clear plastic sleeve. Students will not be able to borrow equipment from other students once they have entered the examination room. If required, bottled water, glucose lollies and tissues may be brought to the examination.

Students are encouraged to speak with their teachers about any subject specific requirements to be brought to the exam and the specific rules around this (eg. Maths note sheets).

RULES AND EXPECTATIONS: All students will be in the correct formal uniform for all examinations and are expected to arrive at the examination room 20 minutes before the scheduled start of the exam.

Mobile phones, smartwatches, pencil cases, calculator covers, school bags etc. must not be brought into the examination room.

There will be no student movement during the first and last half an hour of each examination. Students are required to remain in the examination room until the allocated time has lapsed.

Students must not disturb others at any time during the examination; silent conditions will be strictly enforced. Student behaviour that disrupts the conduct of the exam or other students may result in removal from the exam room and/or impact their achievement in the assessment.

ABSENCES: Absence from any examination will require communication with the College by **9 am** on the day of the exam. Evidence for absence (eg. Medical certificate) must be submitted to verify absence at an exam.

Unexplained or unverified absences will result in an '**Incomplete**' grade recorded and a **zero** result for this assessment. This may impact both the overall grade received for the subject and subject choices for 2026.

Planned absences must be communicated to Year Level Coordinators as early as possible. An alternative time for missed exams due to planned absence will be accommodated where possible.

SPECIAL PROVISIONS: Students that regularly receive special provisions in accordance with their Personalised Plan for Learning will be provided these in the examinations. Subject teachers, invigilators and learning support coordinators will work with these students for their individual provisions.

CATCH UP EXAMS: There will not be Catch Up Exam sessions available for missed exams. Explained absence that has been verified with reasoning in line with our Assessment Policy will have exam results removed from reporting calculations. Absence that has not been verified will result in an Incomplete grade and a zero result for the assessment.

STUDY ROOM: A study room will be provided on the Flinders Park Campus for Year 10 students to use when they are not in exams. To access the study room, students must sign in and out of student services at Flinders Park Campus.
