- **Thursday 25th to Monday 29th June:** Students will have scheduled **examinations**
- **Tuesday 30th June to Thursday 2nd July:** Students will undertake normal lessons with opportunities for subject / exam feedback and career focussed lessons. **All lessons will be undertaken at St Gabriel's**
- **Thursday 2nd July: Flinders Enrichment Program.** Students have the opportunity to participate in a day of fun, practical and informative workshops across a range of study areas. Numbers are limited. To opt-in to this event students are required to register at [Register for Flinders University Enrichment Program | Nazareth Catholic Community](#) which will open on Tuesday, 9 June 2026 at 6:00pm. Registrations close on Tuesday, 16 June 2026 at 5:00pm. Information about this opportunity will also be shared with students during their EIF lessons.
- **Career Expo Tuesday 30th June:** Students will travel by Nazareth shuttle buses from 2pm to Kidman Park for the Careers Expo. Students will be **dismissed from Kidman Park** at 3:25pm. Families are encouraged to attend the Careers Expo from 3:30pm. Information sessions on "How to get an Apprenticeship" and a "SACE explainer" will also be offered. More details will come out via the school newsletter closer to the event.
- **Friday 3rd July: Subject Selections and Pathways Day at Kidman Park campus.** Students are asked to make their own way to and from Kidman Park on this day (9am – 3:25pm). As students will spend the entire day at the Kidman Park campus as part of their transition to SACE, a sausage sizzle lunch will be provided. Students are however, welcome to instead bring their lunch or purchase something from the cafe.

Should your child be absent due to illness, a medical certificate is to be supplied for that day.

Examination Details

To assist students in developing the skills and necessary expertise, examinations are scheduled for many Year 10 subjects at the end of each semester. Utilising similar procedures to those undertaken for SACE Examinations, the College provides this type of assessment with the purpose of assessing knowledge and understanding of the coursework, strengthening concepts of organisation and revision, and preparing students for future examinations. Examination results will be recorded on SEQTA and on the Semester 1 Report.

WHEN: The exams will be held over a 3-day period from Thursday 25th to Monday 29th June. *Please see examination schedule on the next page.* All students will have Wednesday 24th June off to use as a study-from-home day in preparation for their exams.

WHERE: Examinations will be held upstairs at our St Gabriel's campus.

Students are ***only to be at school when they have an examination scheduled.*** Students with an examination in sessions 1 and 3, with a break in between, must sign in at Student Services and stay on site. If students are on-site at other times, they must also sign in and work silently in the cafe area.

Please note the café will not be open for service during these days.

HOW DO STUDENTS PREPARE: Students should check with their teachers about the subject matter that will be examined and the requirements for each examination ie use of a calculator, note sheets, etc. and allocate time during the weeks preceding the examinations specifically for revision.

WHAT TO BRING TO THE EXAM: Students should bring the appropriate equipment for the subject (*at least 2 pens, sharp pencils, ruler, eraser, calculator, etc*) in a clear plastic sleeve. Students will not be able to borrow equipment from other students once they have entered the examination room. If required bottled water, glucose lollies and tissues may be brought to the examination.

RULES AND EXPECTATIONS:

All students will be in the correct formal uniform for all examinations and are expected to arrive 10 minutes before the scheduled start of the exam and wait downstairs in the café.

Mobile phones, smartwatches, pencil cases, calculator covers, school bags, airpods etc. must not be brought into the examination room. These must be placed in their secure locker.

There will be no student movement during the first and last half hours of each examination. Students are required to remain in the examination room until the allocated time has lapsed. Students must not disturb others at any time during the examination; silent conditions will be strictly enforced.

Absence from any examination will require communication with the College by **9 am** on the day of the exam, and a medical certificate supplied for illnesses. ***Unexplained absences*** will result in an '**Incomplete**' grade recorded and a **zero** result for this assessment. This may impact both the overall grade received for the subject and subject choices for the following year.

Report Release Date:

Whilst live grading and ongoing access to student results is available via SEQTA, to ensure the inclusion of final assessments and examination results, Year 10 and 11 Semester reports will be released in Term 3, Week 1, on Friday 24th July.

Year 10 & 11 students will have a study at home day. Students and their families will have the opportunity to have a phone call with their Mentor Group teacher to discuss subject selections for 2027.
