## Skills Day: Industry Spotlight Sessions & Micro-credential Modules

Nazareth aims to provide students with a range of possible pathway experiences during their time at the College. This year we are offering students the opportunity to choose an Industry Spotlight Session or Micro-credential Module, as listed below.

Students not at Skills Day activities will continue to work through Pathways booklets at school with their teachers.

### DETAILS:

- Activities provided should be considered by students in relation to their individualised pathway, rather than based on peer choices.
- Skills Day activities are subject to numbers. Activities may be cancelled due to low numbers. Activities with more registrations than available places have a waiting list, and where possible another opportunity may be scheduled for a future date.
- By selecting an activity, students are confirming their commitment to attend.
- Some activities involve a training component and as such incur a nominal fee. Providers have discounted these fees, resulting in a reduced cost to families. Payment is to be paid on registration of an event and will not be refunded due to absence or change of mind.
- Transport to and from venues off campus will be provided.
- Permission via Consent to Go will be sent out after registrations have closed.

## Faith Formation Day – Be the Change

Nazareth Catholic College promotes a holistic range of experiences to support students in their academic, well-being and spiritual growth. This is a compulsory day for Year 11 students to strengthen relationships with peers and teachers and to nourish their individual spirituality.

Students will begin their day at the Kidman Park campus, with opportunities to be involved in a range of Outreach activities after lunch.

### DETAILS:

- Students are asked to donate one toiletry item, eg. soap, shampoo, deodorant, etc to be used in creating care packages in support of the Aboriginal Catholic Ministry.
- Recess and lunch will be provided.
- Students will be transported to their chosen Acts of Service location.
- Students with an activity at a Nazareth campus, will be dismissed from this site at 3:25pm.
- Students off-site will be transported back to Kidman Park campus for dismissal at 3:25pm.

## Examination Details

To assist students in developing the skills and necessary expertise, examinations are scheduled for many Stage 1 (Year 11) subjects at the end of each semester. Utilising similar procedures to those undertaken for SACE Stage 2 (Year 12) Examinations, the College provides this type of assessment with the purpose of assessing knowledge and understanding of the coursework, strengthening concepts of organisation and revision, and preparing students for Stage 2 SACE Examinations. Examination results will be recorded on SEQTA and the Semester 1 Report.

**WHEN:** The exams will be held over a 4-day period from Tuesday 23 to Friday 26 June. Please see Examination schedule on the next page. All students will have Monday 22 June off to use as a study-from-home day in preparation for their exams.

**WHERE:** Examinations will be held upstairs at our Senior Campus at Kidman Park.

Students are **only to be at school when they have an examination scheduled**. Students with an examination in sessions 1 and 3, with a break in between, must sign in at Student Services and stay on site. If students are on-site at other times, they must also sign in and work silently in the Hub area.

**HOW DO STUDENTS PREPARE:** Students should check with their teacher(s) about the subject matter that will be examined and the requirements for each examination ie use of a calculator, note sheets, etc. and allocate time during the weeks preceding the examinations specifically for revision.

**WHAT TO BRING TO THE EXAM:** Students should bring the appropriate equipment for the subject (*at least 2 pens, sharp pencils, ruler, eraser, calculator, etc*) in a clear plastic sleeve. Students will not be able to borrow equipment from other students once they have entered the examination room. If required bottled water, glucose lollies and tissues may be brought to the examination.

**ELECTRONIC EXAMS:** Students are to ensure they have the Safe Exam Browser installed and that their laptop is charged fully prior to their examination. They must also have shut down and restarted their laptop to ensure the program required is updated. All windows must be closed prior to entering the examination room.

**RULES AND EXPECTATIONS:** All students will be in the correct formal uniform for all examinations and are expected to arrive in the Café area 10 minutes before the scheduled start of the exam.

**Mobile phones, smartwatches,** pencil cases, calculator covers, school bags, airpods etc. must not be brought into the examination room. These must be placed in their secure locker.

There will be no student movement during the first and last half an hour of each examination. Students are required to remain in the examination room until the allocated time has lapsed. Students must not disturb others at any time during the examination; silent conditions will be strictly enforced.

Absence from any examination will require communication with the College by **9 am** on the day of the exam, and a medical certificate supplied for illnesses. **Unexplained absences** will result in an **'Incomplete'** grade recorded and a **zero** result for this assessment. This may impact both the overall SACE grade received for the subject and subject choices for the following year.

## Report Release Date:

Whilst live grading and ongoing access to student results is available via SEQTA, to ensure the inclusion of final assessments and examination results, Year 10 and 11 Semester reports will be released in Term 3, Week 1, on Friday 24<sup>th</sup> July.

## *Made in the Image of God* Sexuality and Respectful Relationships Curriculum (MITIOG) – Stage 1 Religion Education

Dear Parents and Caregivers,

The *Made in the Image of God* Sexuality and Respectful Relationships Curriculum (MITIOG) is the official program for sexuality and respectful relationships education in South Australian Catholic Schools for Years R-12. Each year our students engage with age-appropriate curriculum content regarding sexuality and respectful relationships through MITIOG. This year, the curriculum will be taught during Term 2 Week 8-9.

Catholic understanding is that all humans are made in the image of God and therefore deserving of the utmost dignity and honour, and that our sexuality is a fundamental dimension of the human person. We acknowledge that the beliefs, values and insights of the Christian Tradition and Catholic moral teaching enrich lives.

The MITIOG curriculum content is captured and delivered across 2-year stages. This year, the content to be covered for Year 11 will be:

- *Moral and safe decision making in a Catholic context*
- *An appreciation of the nature of intimacy and commitment in relationships, and the role they play in human flourishing*
- *An appreciation of the Christian understanding of the human person in an exploration of the legal and moral responsibilities regarding sexual identity and behaviour*

We acknowledge that families are the first educators of their child's sexuality and that it is the role of the school to support families in this area. We are committed to supporting and enriching these partnerships.
